


Enterprise Risk Management at the National Science Foundation

Today's Purpose:

 To summarize Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) efforts to date and elicit National Science Board (NSB) perspectives on embracing and managing risks

Outcome:

- Understanding of ERM next steps at NSF
- Ensuring alignment of NSB & NSF approaches to ERM



ERM Year One Progress

- Leadership: Director, Chief Operating Officer, and Assistant Directors support ERM
- Director's Watch List and National Science Board Risk Discussions
- Developed a "maturity based" ERM strategy and process
- OMB concurred with our plans and NSF met OMB's first major milestone by developing an "initial" risk profile by June 2017
- Collaborated with the OIG to discuss road rules on how we can work together
- Lessons Learned
 - Move beyond Budget, Finance and Award Management initial efforts
 - Improve governance and clarify NSF-wide roles and responsibilities for ERM to guard against "compliance exercise" risks and maximize "value" to NSF
 - Governmentwide trends and lesson learned, "where do we go from here?"

NSF ERM Development

Proposed Year 2 Implementation of ERM

Planning

July to October 2017

Complete planning for year 2 based on NSF leadership and NSB feedback.

Training & Governance

Implement NSF ERM Framework **Update Risk Profile**

Monitor, Repeat & Refine

By December 2017

Establish an ERM Community of Practice (COP).

Complete training modules to support **NSF** Directorates.

January 2018 to March 2018

NSF ERM COP updates initial risk profile and establishes regular reporting process.

April 2017 to **June 2018**

NSF Leadership reviews and approves "complete" risk profile.

July 2018 to Year 3

NSF continually develops and further matures **ERM** implementation across NSF.
